CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

As soon as we get Christmas and New Year celebrations over, we look forward to a better new year than the one just passed, booking holidays, arranging outings etc. The year has not started well for those people affected by the recent floods who have lost everything.

It is much the same for the Parish Council, arranging dates of meetings, sorting out budgets along with deciding what projects to pursue for the year.

The first of these at the time of writing is well underway. That is the improvements to the war memorial and grounds. As I write, the worn and broken steps are being replaced and the footpaths are being sorted out. The end result should be that the area is easier to maintain. Later, springtime flowers will be planted. This work has been funded by the Parish Council with a grant from the housing panel and Groundwork Leeds.

We are looking to find sponsors from within the community to fund a rail to keep the poppy wreaths in place; this will go right round the memorial and prevent the wreaths blowing everywhere.

The second and biggest project is to provide a skate park that will accommodate all skateboards, B.M.X's scooters etc.

This was first asked for some 16 years ago and the children who asked are now waiting to take their children on it (perhaps to show off their skateboarding skills). We now have plans drawn up to make this a reality. This work will be overseen by Groundwork Leeds.

If you walk up to Kippax from the Moorgate there is a footpath called Filly Cobs, or Pig Hill, or footpath 35 to give it its LCC number. Thanks to sterling work by our Village services team for their persistence and also thanks to Cllr Harland, it has been re-surfaced and should now be usable by all.

The village services team also reports graffiti, litter, fly tipping, malicious damage as well as persistently reporting dog mess, and in the period December to January reported 10 cases. Most of these have been sorted out.

Over the Christmas /New Year period someone took a liking to two of the figures around the village. The Santa has been recovered but the penguin from the Calvert flower bed is still at large, he disappeared between 2.30 am and 11.30 am on New Year's Day. If you know anything please contact any Councillor.

I can also announce that the mini Breeze event that we held last year on Kippax Common playing fields will be coming back again this year. Dates and venue are to be decided but plans are taking shape.

In the last magazine I mentioned a Scarecrow competition for the village (just a fun thing) I have details on how to organise this but need helpers. Anyone interested?

Before you fall asleep from reading this please don't forget the photo competition. The winning pictures will win a prize and feature in the 2017 calendar, if we get enough entries.


Hello from Everybody at Kippax Library



Dear resident,

I'm pleased to be able to report on an issue I campaigned on throughout my re-election campaign in 2015.

The Prime Minister recently announced new measures to support mental health care and awareness in England. This is a crucial issue here in Elmet & Rothwell where we have some great community initiatives to support those experiencing mental health difficulties. I'm a regular visitor to the Growing Zone in Kippax and was especially delighted to visit in April 2015 with the Prime Minister's wife, Samantha Cameron.

June Perkin and her team at the Growing Zone have created a fantastic haven for people dealing with learning difficulties, disabilities and mental health issues. From my visits to the Growing Zone and from my MP Advice Surgeries I know of the broad range of concerns mental health issues create for individuals and families and I believe today's announcement is a real step in the right direction.

The specific measures, which will apply in England only, include:

- £247m over the next five years so that every hospital has mental services in their Accident and Emergency unit
- A new waiting time target for teenagers with eating disorders, which will track the number of patients being seen within a month of being referred
- □ Over £400 million to enable 24/7 treatment in communities as a safe and effective alternative to hospital

This is just one of many campaigns I've been involved in, so if there's any issue you'd like to raise with me please do get in touch.



KIPPAX IN BLOOM

At the time of writing, we have just entered a new year. All of us who are associated with Kippax in Bloom will be hoping that we can repeat our successes in 2016. With our developing reputation as an award-winning floral village, there is a desire to continue on that path as we represent Yorkshire in the Britain in Bloom competition this year.

In preparation for the visit to Kippax in summer of the 2 RHS judges we have been working hard over the winter months, pruning bushes, trees and shrubs, weeding, tidying, clearing up litter and adding compost to our beds. We've planted bulbs to brighten up the Spring when it comes. Considering the rain that has teemed down over the winter months, most of this work has been carried out on dull, misty and rainy days.

One of the requirements of Britain in Bloom is that we develop new projects in addition to that which has already been created over the last decade or so. Of course, one new project was forced on us following that Saturday evening in September when we were reminded just how easily all the good work can be destroyed. An apparently drunk driver speeding up Leeds Road lost control of his car and destroyed the bed at Calvert Close, including uprooting a silver birch tree which the group had planted. Fortunately no-one was injured and gardens can be renewed.

Much work has already been done in clearing the area completely, removing everything. Plants will be saved and replanted while the bed is to be completely re-designed so you will all see a completely new look when it is completed.

Another new initiative will see a re-vamp of Butt Hill gardens now that the building work at the former Royal Oak pub is completed. Lots of pruning and tidying up has already been done and we have plans to change some of the planting and add more colour.

Another new development follows at the request of our library staff who are keen to help us brighten up our Library outside and consequently we will see the addition of planters for early summer.

Bloomers will again be working closely with Kippax North School and we are grateful for their marvellous support

These last two elements are very important as the 'In Bloom' competitions are not just about flower beds and pots: they are also about community involvement. Consequently our work with local schools, cubs, brownies, guides and scouts, the Growing Zone and so on is very important, as are the front and back garden competitions.

Once again it is important to thank the Parish Council who sponsor and support our work, as well as our local ward councillors, the Parks and Countryside Department of Leeds City Council, Woodend Nursery, our sponsors and of course our volunteers.

As always, we would welcome more volunteers. Offering your time does not necessarily need to be every week but as and when you can. 
As usual, the event proved hugely popular and we are once more reprising the show for those who were unable to get tickets.

TALKING OF COMFORT ZONES.

A couple of years ago my colleague Diana McEwan wrote in this magazine that it is good for us if we sometimes aim to achieve something which appears to be outside our 'comfort zone'. She did, she did a Tandem Parachute Jump. How fantastic is that? Like me she is not a teenager.

I was really pleased for her, I couldn't have done it.

Diana also asked to hear from anyone else who had pushed themselves into doing something a bit different.

Well, I am not aware that anyone has contacted us yet, so last November when another friend told me that there was a new Zip-wire at a place in Portugal that we both sometimes visit. I looked for details.

It actually starts off descending in Spain from Sanlucar de Guadiana, crosses over the Guadiana River and ends up in Alcoutim in Portugal.

It is the only cross-border zip-line in the world of 2,160feet (720 meters) in distance. You start off 684 feet (228 meters) above sea level; you travel at 45 – 50 Miles per hour (70-80 kilometers per hour) so it actually takes less than a minute!

You are also a Time Traveller flying through time because there is a one hour time difference between the two countries. How cool is that??

So you can guess the rest, I gathered up my courage, it only took a year, and I went for it. You are fitted with a body harness which has a huge clamp fastening you to the wire and a hard hat (which worried me a little). Then you are pushed out of the little cabin high on the hillside all on your own dangling in the wild blue yonder. It was so exhilarating and exciting, the views were amazing but it was over too soon. All my fears were forgotten, I may do it again!!




Each class draws up criteria for an effective Class Representative; they nominate children to run for election and the campaigning begins with children writing their manifestos.
