### THE VIEW FROM A KIPPAX GARDEN by EBG Jardinero Esq.

Since writing the previous article at the end of January and writing this towards the end of May, the changes to our daily lives has been unprecedented in my lifetime. Thank you to all those who have helped others and deepest sympathies to everyone who has suffered loss.

With flower shows and garden visits having been cancelled, there has been an increase in the amount of content on-line. Virtual tours of gardens by the National Garden Scheme are fantastic to look at (find them at <a href="https://www.ngs.org.uk/virtual-garden-visits">www.ngs.org.uk/virtual-garden-visits</a>).

With RHS Chelsea Flower Show cancelled this year, the RHS made it Virtual and put lots of content on-line at www.rhs.org.uk/shows-events.

I realise I'm fortunate in many ways in being retired and having a garden. I'm convinced though that gardening and growing things have been good for my mental health and lots of other people find benefits in it as well. Local walks within the guidelines have been a chance to see some different views and wildlife everywhere is still getting on with what they need to do. Lovely to see it and indeed, it appears many people are taking more exercise particularly walking and cycling. Hopefully there will also have been more gardening going on.

There's lots of instances of people being creative with little or no garden. Windowsills can be used for growing herbs and house plant sales were increasing before



lockdown. There has also been a surge in popularity of growing micro-greens. This is the growing of seeds of leafy herbs and plants that we would usually let grow to full-size before harvesting. The leaves can be ready to pick just one or two weeks after sowing and will have a concentrated flavour. Grow them in a light position in compost in yoghurt pots with a hole in the bottom, seed trays, plant pots or re-use plastic containers that had fruit in them; they won't be there for long. Sow regular batches throughout the year to keep supplies coming. Seeds to use include coriander, radish, beetroot, basil, fennel, rocket and spinach but there's lots of others.



Here at home, there's not been much rain recently and with watering being required particularly in the greenhouse and for newly planted seedlings and plants, the water butts are getting low.

Two months ago, the lawn was practically lush, having largely recovered from the warm summer weather of 2018. This week it's got some serious brown patches on it. With not watering it, it's come back before and so I'm hoping when we get some rain, it will come back again.

We had to curtail filling the bird feeders earlier than usual this spring because we were inundated outside with a plague of rats (okay there were 3 but to us it was a plague) as they were looking for spilt bird seed. I think they had moved from wherever they usually were due to a shift in everyone's eating patterns. Also, they usually stay apart from human activity but we were going out less at the time. I've made sure that our birdbaths have been topped up with clean water so that the birds have somewhere to drink and bathe. They need to be checked daily but old dustbin lids or shallow containers placed firmly on the ground, make excellent water sources for wildlife to use, in the dry weather.

I bought seeds for this season's vegetable sowing in February so wasn't as affected by the garden centre closures as I might have been (not the most important point in the circumstances but I did miss the accompanying coffees there).

I sowed various seeds in modules in the greenhouse in March and of those, courgette and sweet corn seeds failed to germinate; probably too cold at night. I tried again in April and got 5 courgette plants to grow on. At the same time, I put some sweet corn seeds in with seeds of peas and beans on damp kitchen paper in a plastic tray. A few days later, most of them started to sprout and I potted them up in modules in the greenhouse.

This last week I started at one end of the greenhouse and went through all the pots and modules in there as I needed space to set out nine 12inch pots for tomatoes in the beds. Plants were weeded and pruned and potted on as required. Any re-usable compost was saved and is being used again. I planted out eight seedlings of Tomato 'Golden Crown' and one plant of T. 'Velorcity Beefsteak' which is my guest tomato this year.

Other vegetables I'm growing this year include spring onions, lettuce, mangetout peas, borlotti beans, leeks, kale, peas, dwarf French beans, Squash 'Patty Pan', beetroot and Squash 'Uchiki Kuri'. Some of these need to be planted out after the chance of frost has passed so refer to the information on the seed packet for guidance. Parsnips and carrots are being sown directly into the bed as they don't like being transplanted. I got six Sweet Pepper 'California Wonder' to germinate and I'll keep potting these on and leave them in the greenhouse.


### Jobs for the months ahead

June – Plant out sweet corn in blocks rather than in long rows, as they are wind pollinated. Give bulbs such as daffodils and crocus growing in grass six weeks after flowering and it should be safe to cut them by mowing. Take spent flowers of rhododendrons off by hand to avoid new growth behind being damaged.

July – Regularly water shrubs and trees in containers after checking often how much they need. Keep birdbaths clean to avoid diseases spreading and topped up. Plum, cherry and damsons should be pruned as soon as possible after harvesting as cuts heal rapidly in warm weather which reduces the chances of silver leaf infection.

August – Plan next year's spring bulb display as catalogues become available. Give hardy geraniums a chop to promote fresh growth. Lift spring-sown and spring-planted onions and shallots when the foliage yellows and flops; dry bulbs thoroughly in the sun or greenhouse for two weeks before storing.

Get out, enjoy your garden and stay safe.

### WORKING TO SUPPORT THE ELDERLY AND VULNERABLE-GARFORTH NET

Garforth NET is a registered charity, one of a network of teams across Leeds who exist to support the elderly with the support of Leeds Council. Additional support is also needed in order that NET can continue supporting the over 60s and their carers in our area.

Our local NET covers 46 square miles and includes Kippax as well as 11 other local villages including Garforth, Allerton Bywater, Swillington etc.

Prior to lockdown NET provided a range of activities including lunch clubs, craft activities and support from Dover Street and outlying centres such as Cross Hills, Mount Pleasant and Kippax Hub.

### What is Garforth NET doing now?

Teams of volunteers keep in touch with clients by phone call. Only Monica Walker the Manager is still working in isolation at Dover Street to coordinate the operation. All other staff members are working from home. In Kippax we identified a team of additional volunteers who have been supporting an additional 50 plus people with a friendly phone call. Additional volunteers have collected prescriptions etc. As a result of the pandemic NET is now also supporting other individuals and families who are shielding.

Clients are supplied with food if they have no family members to collect it for them. Kippax Coop, Sainsbury's Tesco Lidl and other stores are contributing food. There is a food collection point in the Kippax Coop. The food is delivered to households by Garforth Lions and other volunteers.

NET is now supporting not only their own clients but hundreds we have been referred through the LCC helpline. NET have supported around 600 families in the Kippax area alone.

Thanks to Kippax Parish Council but donations still needed! Monica said "Many thanks to Kippax Parish Council for their generous donation which has helped greatly. However, the funds are still running low as so many people are being helped!" All donations are welcome

A most selfless man, he presides over the Kippax Parish Council, the Garforth Road Safety Committee and the local branch of the Royal British Legion. He has been secretary of the Old Folks Treat for 30 years, and has strong associations with the Belgrave Methodist Church. His list of associations with voluntary organisations is impressively long.


Says Mr. Cheesbrough: "In short, I have tried to use my talents to the full, and not entirely in my own interests." He has donated his body to the hospital for "spare part" usage, but thinks that "the parts will be worn out when I've done with them!"

His favourite story is of the old-time local preacher who had walked several miles to preach at a small chapel in the country. His congregation consisted of one dear old lady. Should he take the service or have a few words of prayer and return home?

The preacher decided it was his duty to preach. He went through the full service. When the last hymn was announced, the dear old lady looked uncomfortable, for it was that beginning: "Come, O thou traveller unknown," and including the words: "With thee all night I mean to stay, and wrestle till the break of day."

### THE VETERANS CHARITY

Well this is the first time for me writing in this publication so I'd better tell you about myself. My name is Matt Osman and I am one of your Parish Councillors. I joined the council about six months ago. I live in Kippax and have done for the last 17 years. My family also live locally.

My background is in the military, law enforcement and private contractors' area. I have been asked to write about a project very close to my heart which is a charity called The Veterans Charity (http://www.veteranscharity.org.uk)

This small charity has been around for 12 years now having become a registered charity on 11th March 2008 and I have been a volunteer for the past couple of years.

The charity's main focus is to assist veterans of any age, military branch or length of service with immediate needs, support for essentials such as food shopping, clothing, prepayment gas/electricity, mobile phones/credit and household items. The charity is known as the Rapid Reaction Force as it operates without unnecessary red tape.

We have a small office in Barnstaple which is run by our C.E.O Danny Greeno who is our only paid full time worker. Our Trustees include General (rtd) Sir Robert Pascoe KCB MBE and Lt Col (rtd) Vaughan Kent-Payne.

All our money raised goes straight back into helping veterans. Our procedure is - a veteran will fill out our online Support Request Form or gets referred by a partner agency. They are then contacted and their needs assessed. If we can help, one of our four Trustee are contacted to authorise support.

We do not send money to beneficiaries as it may not be put to best use so instead, we use a wide range of suppliers who will take our order and deliver the items directly to the beneficiary.

In the current crisis, the charity has had to adapt the way it provides support and is using its volunteers to complete supermarket shopping which is then delivered in accordance with social distancing guidelines.

Last year, 2019, we dealt with 480 cases and this year so far, we have dealt with 197 cases. Demand for our help is rising sharply and we have seen an increase of 48% compared to the same period last year.

We have a client base from every armed service ranging from young lads fresh back from Afghanistan back to second world war veterans. These clients can suffer from no issues but just needing help with food due to changes in circumstances, to those suffering with severe mental health issues and homelessness.

The charity receives hundreds of referrals from other organisations and charities who need us to deliver immediate needs support to ensure that our beneficiaries are sorted for a few weeks whilst the other agencies put longer term support in place.

As a small charity we have a huge heart and will help for as long as we can.







### A CIRCULAR WALK FROM KIPPAX TO GARFORTH.

This walk starts on Brecks Lane but it be started anywhere on Leeds Road.

There are no stiles but one steep hill, there is chance for a coffee stop and toilets half way. The walk

Start on Brecks Lane (if you need to park please park carefully) and walk away from Leeds Road and walk along the farm track, passing Swallow Hall Farm on your left (at present a farm shop) go down the track to reach a crossroads of paths, turn right and follow this track for a pleasant easy walk, going under a unused railway bridge. Then when you reach the second bridge keep walking straight on the now tarmac path.

The path then reaches a main road, cross carefully and TURN RIGHT walking towards the fire station on the left. Just before you reach the fire station turn left, with the Head Injuries unit now on your right.

Go on and climb straight up the hill between the houses on a tarmac path, keep pausing to admire the view (or get your breath!).

When you reach a track, turn left, after 10 paces and after passing a water tower, turn right into the field. Keep the hedge on your right and follow it to the corner then bare left and follow the edge of the quarry till you reach a farm track, Green Lane. TURN RIGHT

Stay on this track, cross the mini railway tracks, and you will have the Outdoor Shop on your left, keep walking and you will have Strikes Market Garden on your left. This is your chance for toilets and coffee.

Return to the exit road for Strikes and cross the busy road and reach the public footpath sign pointing towards a farm track. Stay on this farm track, as it meanders through a field, then a rabbit warren. The track narrows and can be rough underfoot so take care. Look to the right for some lovely views of Kippax and beyond to the Pennines.

Follow the track, then cross a field to enter a wood. The path is obvious and leads through the wood to the new housing estate. Again, follow this straight down through the houses till you reach a 'ginnel' (or passage to us non-Leeds people) into Baildon Close. Leave the cul de sac and turn right, then left you should then see in front to your right Gibson Lane Doctors surgery. At the surgery turn right, then at the T junction turn right again. You are now on Leeds Road. Follow this passed the Moorgate Pub on your right, then the shops, up the slight incline till you reach Brecks Lane which is on your left.


